# FROM THE PRESIDENT

We've entered the New Year, and looking forward to great things in our community.

We have seated a new board of directors to manage alongside Alliant Property Management

We are thankful that there are dedicated individuals who are willing to take up this work to benefit our community.

The year ahead will be exciting. We are focusing on improvements in our community. Many have asked, "What will we do with all the money in the Reserve?". Spending/investing is set to begin. We have commenced work to improve the storage lot. Coming next will be major sidewalk and curb repairs (approx. 10,000 sq. ft.), street repairs (approx. 1,000 sq. ft.), Chickee Hut re-roofing, and many other projects. In the weeks and months ahead, the board will be reviewing bids on these and other projects.

This month, I also have a rather mundane topic that needs to be discussed – living with dogs in our community. The bottom line here is that more and more owners in Waterways have dogs and many have multiple dogs. Yes, we love our dogs – I am a dog lover for sure. Anyone who knows me, is aware that I have trained my dog Danny, and have worked with him to win two American Kennel Club Master Agility Champion titles. You may have seen me on the street with Skippy practicing some tricks, but here's the deal. Our dogs are required by Collier County to be on a leash when outside of home or yard. All dogs are required to be under the owner's control at all times. Yet here in Waterways, there is a growing number of dogs running freely about the neighborhood, and at times there are owners walking their dogs off-leash.

Dogs roaming the neighborhood may be the result of an accidental escape, but when the escapes happens over and over, they are not accidental. In fact, the dog owner is not in compliance with county ordinance or our community docs. On top of this, roaming dogs represent an unsafe situation. They may be hit by a car, or have a bite incident from an individual who tries to catch the dog for its owner. They can create very bad behavior incidents with other owners who may encounter them while walking their own dog on a leash. For those not knowledgeable about dog behavior, it is important to know that a leashed dog tends to be fearful when a roaming dog repeatedly approaches it....and any dog – even the most lovable, kissy one, may bite if you approach in a way that is misunderstood by the dog.

Please, before someone gets bitten or before a roaming dog is captured by Collier County Domestic Animal Services, let's get this under control. If you have an escape artist, you need to solve the problem. Study dog communication. Check out the trainer, Victoria Stilwell (https://positively.com/); hire a behavioral trainer to help you. Do what you can to make a difference before someone is hurt. Install dog gates inside your home; leash your dog when going out, and be with your dog while he is in your fenced-in yard.

And please pick up your poop!
